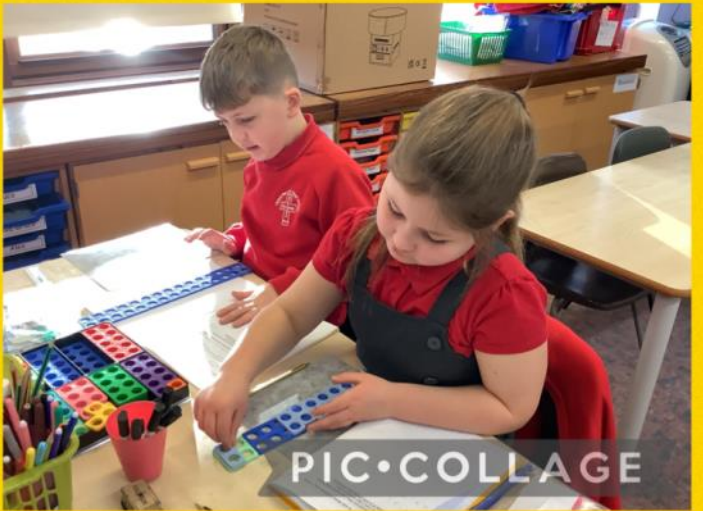

# A busy week in UU



## **Free SEND Parent Workshops - Spring 2026**

Wychavon District Council, in partnership with SENDIASS, will be running **three free training workshops for parents and carers** at local community venues in **Pershore, Evesham and Droitwich**.

The workshops will take place in **each area between January and March 2026** and are designed to support families of children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND).

### **Workshops available**

#### **What does a good Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) look like?**

Learn what makes an effective EHCP, how to be involved in the process, and how to confidently advocate for your child's needs.

#### **What you need to know if your child has an additional need or disability**

An introduction to the SEND system, your rights as a parent or carer, and the support available to help you navigate education and services.

#### **Supporting your child to cope with change (Transitions)**

From everyday changes to bigger transitions such as starting a new school, this workshop offers practical strategies to help your child manage change more confidently.
