Particularly popular are the slices of Victoria Sponge, Lemon Drizzle and chocolate-fudge type sponge cakes/brownies, followed by chocolate crispy/cornflake cakes, and all flavours and styles of cupcakes. Best to avoid nuts altogether.

With the growing awareness of dietary requirements, we also like to be able to offer a selection of gluten free and dairy free bakes.

We will also be very grateful for any shop bought baked goods if baking is not your thing. The emphasis on home baked is with what sells best in mind.

All donations of cakes will help us to raise the vital funds to continue enriching the children's educational enjoyment and wellbeing in the school environment. For information, recent purchases from funds raised are the reading sheds and surrounding groundworks, iPad leasing, new ovens for the school kitchen, musical instruments for all children to use, a Fairy and Gnome Garden area outside the woodland work area, outside storage shed(s), boxes for equipment, a First Aid Course for Upper Unit etc. etc.

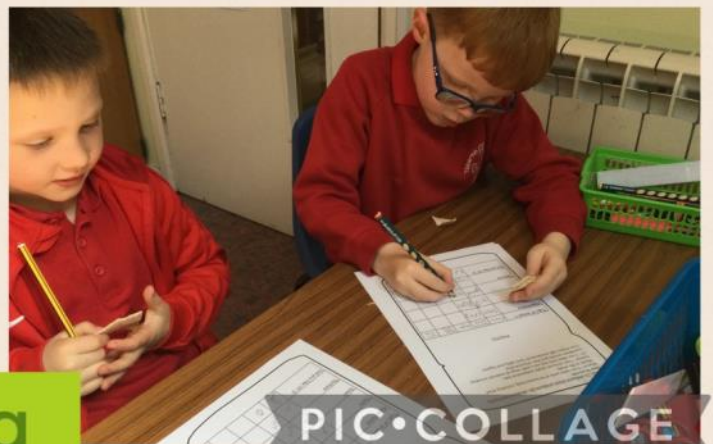

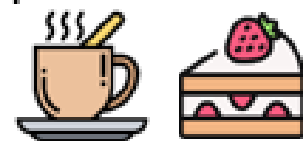
This is a huge opportunity for Friends of Tibberton to raise money for our school that will make a big impact. In the previous 2 years we have made more than £3500!
