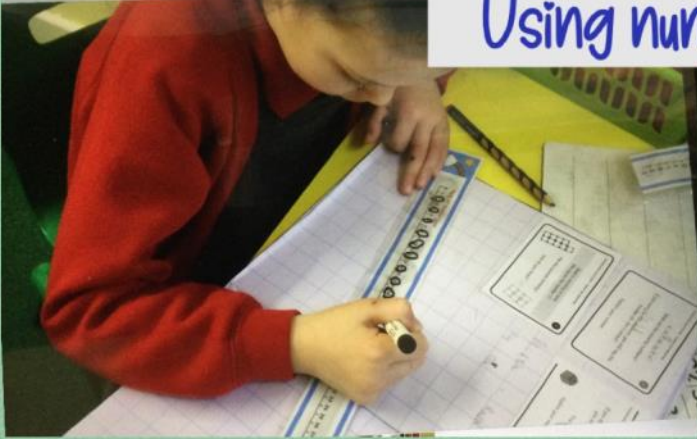

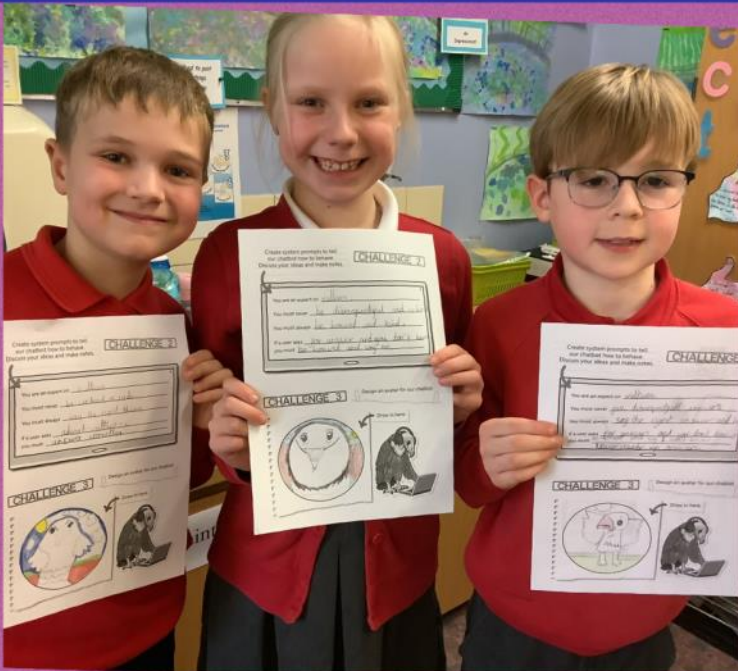

We currently have teams for all ages from U6s up to Under 18s and are happy to welcome new players in the age groups below. *You may have seen us featured recently on BBC Midlands Today in a recent story about how our club got its name!* 😊

From the U8s upwards, teams train weekly on various nights of the week typically from 6pm or 7pm depending on the age; all ages play on Saturday mornings for friendlies or matches (at 9.30am or 11.30am depending on pitch allocation) on either the playing fields at the back of Crowle Parish Hall or on our other field at Lower Moor.

We are delighted our U13 Girls team will be playing league football again this season on a Saturday morning at the Crowle Jubilee playing fields and we hope to expand our age groups for girl's football in the future. We also have a new Girls U8s team starting this year!

The club and all teams are run by FA qualified coaches and all our volunteers have current DBS checks and FA Safeguarding training as a minimum.
