


We created jewellery using clay and decorated our pebbles with our Stoneage names!





Princess Elizabeth was born at 2.40am on 21 April 1926, at 17 Bruton Street in Mayfair, London. The Princess was christened Elizabeth Alexandra Mary at Buckingham Palace on 29 May that year.




As a toddler, Princess Elizabeth's grandfather, King George V, was on the throne, and she was third in the line of succession to the throne.




Princess Elizabeth's younger sister Princess Margaret was born in 1930.


UU have created a timeline of the Queen's first 30 years!




In 1936 Princess Elizabeth's life changed dramatically. Her grandfather, King George V, died and her uncle decided to give up the throne in order to marry the woman he loved, Mrs Wallis Simpson.




Princess Elizabeth's father became King George VI, and in 1937 the two Princesses attended their parents' Coronation in Westminster Abbey.




The Second World War began in 1939, and a year later, at the height of the Blitz, the Princesses were moved for their safety to Windsor Castle, where they spent most of the war years. Princess Elizabeth was educated at home.



When Princess Elizabeth was 21, she became engaged to Prince Phillip on 9 July 1947 and the couple were married in Westminster Abbey on 20 November that year.



On 6 February 1952, King George VI died following a prolonged illness. Princess Elizabeth was on a Royal Visit to Kenya when she became Queen Elizabeth II.



The Coronation took place in Westminster Abbey on 2 June 1953, attended by 8,251 guests. Crowds of people viewed the procession despite heavy rain. For the first time, the ceremony was televised around the world - 27 million people in the UK alone tuned in to watch.

Reception children are PARROTS:

WHAT WE COLLECT:

We accept the following ‘good quality’ items for RE-USE*:

- Men’s, Ladies’ and Children’s clothing
- Paired shoes (tied together or elastic band around)
- Handbags
- Hats
- Bags
- Scarves and ties
- Jewellery
- Lingerie
- Socks
- Belts
- Soft toys
- Household linen
- Household curtains
- Household towels
- Household bedding (bed sheets, pillow cases and duvet covers)

** We reserve the right to refuse any unsuitable items*

We DO NOT accept:

- *Duvets and blankets*
- *Pillows and cushions*
- *Carpets, rugs and mats (including bath, shower and toilet mats)*
- *Soiled, painted, ripped or wet clothing*
- *School uniforms with and without logo*
- *Corporate clothing and workwear*
- *Textile off cuts, yarns or threaded material*

The collection is then weighed and we send your PTA/School a cheque. You can earn up to £400 per tonne pro rata.

The Friends PTA team have arranged for every family to receive some Bags2schools recycling bags to store your textiles in ready for collection day. **Please drop off at the Village Hall from 7.45 am. Collection will be anywhere between 9am and 12 pm.**
